
BRITISH VALUE 1: DEMOCRACY

The principle of democracy is consistently being reinforced at Henley-in-Arden School, with democratic processes being used for important decisions within the school community. For instance, elections are held for the School Council, Prefects positions, Form and Sport Captains, IAG Representatives and Literacy Champions. The principle of democracy is explored in English, History and Religious Studies lessons as well as in form time and assemblies. Student surveys and interviews are conducted throughout the year to seek their views on school developments.



BRITISH VALUE 2: INDIVIDUAL LIBERTY

At Henley-in-Arden School, students are actively encouraged to make independent choices, with the knowledge that they are in a safe, secure and supportive environment. We empower and provide boundaries for students to make informed choices, through a safe environment and an empowering education. Students are encouraged to value, know, understand and exercise their rights and personal freedoms and are advised on how to exercise these safely, for example through e-safety and Form Time work. We have a robust anti-bullying culture to protect students from any form of discrimination and prejudice. Our safeguarding team provides outstanding support and guidance to protect the rights and interests of all students in the school. Effective IAG guidance allows all students in years 8-13 make informed choices about their future education and career opportunities.



BRITISH VALUE 3: The Rule of Law

The importance of laws, whether they be those that govern the class, the school, or the country, are consistently reinforced at Henley-in-Arden School. Students are taught the value of and reasons behind laws, that they govern and protect us, the responsibilities this involves and the consequences when laws are broken. Visits from authorities such as the Police, Prevent and Fire Services reinforce this message. Students are encouraged to respect the rules and expectations of the school as part of our 'Getting It Right' system. The involvement of students in the review of school rules helps them to understand the reasons behind rules. As a result students at Henley fully understand their role in adhering to rule of law to protect themselves and all members of their community.



BRITISH VALUE 4: MUTUAL RESPECT

Respect is at the core of our ethos and is modelled by staff and students alike. Students learn that their behaviour has an effect on their own rights and those of others. All members of the school community are encouraged to treat each other with respect irrespective of their race, religion, culture, gender or sexual orientation. Our curriculum provides regular opportunities for pupils to express their views in a safe and mutually supportive environment. As part of our new College system students from different year groups now engage positively in learning, social and extra-curricular opportunities on a daily basis. Our Anti-Bullying policy reinforces the importance of valuing friendships and building positive relationships in school and in the wider community.



BRITISH VALUE 5: TOLERANCE OF THOSE OF DIFFERENT FAITHS AND BELIEFS

As school that celebrates diversity and difference, we empower students with the ability to understand their place in a culturally diverse society. We have different languages spoken in the school and students actively and independently learn from each other on a daily basis. Students share their faith and beliefs within the school and we celebrate a diverse range of religious festivals throughout the calendar year as part of our 'Themes of the Week' programme. Students visit places of worship that are important to different faiths and celebrate music and dance from different countries and religious backgrounds. We provide a prayer room in the school for students to reflect and are sensitive to the needs of all students at key stages of the religious cycle, e.g. Easter, Eid and Ramadan.
