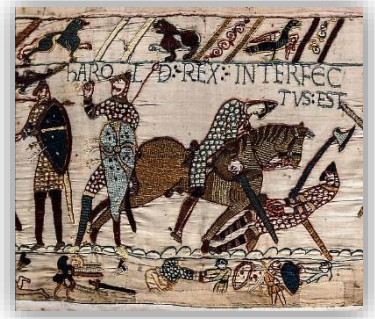


Year 8 Curriculum Enrichment Trip – France 2018

Conduct:

We expect the same high standards of behaviour and conduct of our students when they are on an educational visit as we do when they are in school. In fact, as we are in a public place and students are representing the school, they arguably need to be even higher.

The following expectations apply:

General:

- Students must check in with their group-leader regularly and must not be late for check-in points
- Students must always be with at least one other student from school and should **never** be alone at any point during the visit
- The same systems that apply in school will apply on the trip – consequence points (C1-4) may be issued if students are not doing as they should and other sanctions (for example, a period without a mobile phone) may be used if students are not behaving as they should
- In the highly unlikely event of extreme misbehaviour, parents will be contacted and the full range of sanctions (including isolation and exclusion) may apply when back in school

Mobile telephones:

- Students are allowed to bring their mobile phone and iPad/tablet (though they are responsible for them). However, all mobile phones and tablets must be handed in each evening and will be handed out again in the morning. Any students found not to have handed in electronic devices will lose the privilege to have them during the day.

At the hotel:

- We are not staying in a residential centre for schools – we are staying in public hotels where people will have paid money for a restful night's sleep – therefore, students must be respectful of this
- Students must not enter each other's rooms – this is a safeguarding issue and also means that belongings are secure. This includes boys in other boys' rooms and girls in other girls' rooms
- Any high price items should be limited and valuables should be stored in the hotel safe(s). Group leaders should be made aware of any valuables

Clothing:

- It is likely that the weather will be warm in France, so this should make packing easier. However, no crop tops or see-through clothing is acceptable and students will be asked to change if what they are wearing is deemed inappropriate, especially as some activities will involve visiting places of worship and memorials.
- Although warm weather is anticipated due to the time of year, please check the forecast and ensure that students have something warm and waterproof in case of inclement weather. Please could you remind your son/daughter to keep their waterproofs in their rucksack at all times!

Kit list:

- Clothing for five days (including what they will travel out in)
- Appropriate night wear. Students will be sharing rooms
- Walking shoes/trainers (we will be walking a considerable distance over the five days)
- Another pair of shoes suitable to wear indoors
- A waterproof jacket (a Pac A Mack would be ideal)
- Wash bag with enough toiletries for the trip
- A small bag/rucksack to carry a packed lunch in
- Camera/phone
- Powerpack for the coach (to charge mobile)
- Sunglasses
- Sun cream
- Sun hat
- Money (Euros and pound sterling). A maximum of €100 and £20
- All meals are included but not lunch on the day of outward travel or supper on the way back, so please make sure to pack some snacks for the outward journey and pound sterling for lunch and supper
- DVDs for the coach (12 rating and under)

Please note:

- Electrical items such as hairdryers and phone chargers will require an adapter as sockets require two round pins
